Trip Itinerary

- 1 - Arrival at Kathmandu (1334 m) and shift to Hotel
- 2 - Fly to Lukla (2800m) and Trek to Phakding (2610m)
- 3 - Namche Bazaar (3440m) (11,290f) 13. K.m
- 4 - Rest day / Acclimatization in Namche Bazar
- 5 - Trek to Phortse (3800m)
- 6 - Trek to Dingboche (4410m)
- 7 - Rest day at Dingboche
- 8 - Trek to Lobuche (4940m)
- 9 - Everest Base Camp (5364m) & back to Gorakshep (5180m)
- 10 - Kalapathar/(5550M)(18,192f) and Lobuche base camp
- 11 - Climbing day and back to Pheriche

- 12 - Trek to Monjo (2835m)
- 13 - Trek to Lukla
- 14 - Fly to Kathmandu / Ramechhap
- 15 - Half-day sightseeing and departure
